## PROGRAM NOTES

*enVISION: Sensory Beyond Sight* is an immersive interdisciplinary performance that does not solicit the viewers' sight but rather all their other senses by the elaboration of new atmospheres and through a close interaction between the performer and the spectator. The work has brought together a team of collaborators around a single challenge: to tell a story through dance and theater beyond their visual dimension.

Specifically conceived with and for individuals who are low-vision and blind, the work proposes a new sensorial experience of dance and theater. It will be presented to a live audience who can choose to experience the show blindfolded and will invite six audience members to be guided by a performer into the setting of the work, over a specific journey that tells a collective story through textures, movements, sounds, music, scents, storytelling, and audience participation. Participatory audience members who are sighted will wear a cover over their eyes as they enter the work until the end of the performance, allowing both sighted and unsighted people to share the experience.

## ABOUT SHALEIGH DANCE WORKS

**SHALEIGH DANCE WORKS (SDW)** is a nonprofit, dance-theater company dedicated to inspiring people of all abilities, social backgrounds, cultures, and generations with the transformative power of dance. Under the direction of founder and artistic director ShaLeigh Comerford, SDW is recognized for its socially conscious works, expansive movement language, and commitment to community action. The company was founded with a premiere at the 4th annual Greensboro Fringe Festival in 2005. Since receiving a standing ovation at their NYC debut at Judson Church two years later, a whirlwind of performances launched SDW into recognition as an emerging dance theater company. Their success has taken them from performances and creative residencies in NYC to Germany, England, Israel, and Japan.

SDW creates programming at the intersection of art, culture, and social change to enrich our communities. The company also offers multiple performances that bring mixed-ability movers to professional stages and panel discussions on making dance inclusive to people with disabilities. SDW's engagement practices are an integral part of their work and include partnerships with The Reality Center, Arts Access, Vision Insights, InSightful Visionaries, and Dark Room Ballet to provide advocacy, opportunities, and access to the arts for all people. With a focus on artistic excellence, nurturing artists, and designing programs to empower those impacted by marginalization, SDW aims to provide a concrete example of how dance can transform people's lives and enrich society.

## BIOGRAPHIES

**SHALEIGH COMERFORD (ARTISTIC DIRECTOR)** is an Irish and Native American choreographer and the artistic director of ShaLeigh Dance Works. Her work is driven by a desire to uplift powerful stories and voices that address the human condition in relation to inequalities and forces of erasure. Her work stresses our instinctive human need to connect regardless of race, class, age, ability, or gender. She is a graduate of Hollins University with a master's degree in Visual and Performing Arts. ShaLeigh began her formal dance training on scholarship with the Roanoke Ballet Theatre and the American Dance Festival and continued her training in NYC and at P.A.R.T.S in Brussels, Belgium. In 2011, she was personally invited to train in the Gaga movement language with Ohad Naharin and the Batsheva Dance Company in Tel Aviv, Israel, for their inaugural teacher training program.

ShaLeigh was a principal dancer with the Roanoke Ballet Theatre where she performed and toured with the company from 2000 to 2004. She performed leading roles with the Virginia Ballet Academy and guest roles with the Carolina Ballet and Cirque USA. She has also apprenticed with the Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Company and has performed with Keigwin & Company, Tina Croll & Company, Mark Dendy Dance & Theater, Carolina Ballet, Martha Clarke, and Rosie Herrera, as well as a restaging of Batsheva Dance Company's *Minus Sixteen* and an official music video for Blind by Christian Löffler.

ShaLeigh's choreography and commissions have been presented throughout the United States and abroad. She is a recipient of the 2018 Ella Pratt Fountain Emerging Artist Award and an award winner in the 2013 Tokyo Experimental Festival of Sound, Art & Performance to design a performance installation at the Institute of Contemporary Art and International Cultural Exchange. ShaLeigh currently serves as Adjunct Instructor of dance at Elon University and Washington & Lee University. She is also founder and a practitioner of ShaGa Movement.

**DAVIAN ROBINSON (CO-DIRECTOR & PERFORMER)**, born in Hickory, NC, is a dancer, choreographer, Paralympic athlete, and motivational speaker. Currently living in Durham, NC, Davian graduated from UNC Charlotte in 2020 with bachelor's degrees in both Science and Art. He attended Governor Morehead School for the Blind in Raleigh, NC, from 200 to 2011. Davian has performed at Orsolina 28 and The Palace of Venaria in Italy, UNC Charlotte, MOVE Dance Alliance, Loose Leaves Showcase, and Reactions of Resistance. Notably, he was selected to perform in Adidas "Impossible is Nothing" spec commercial, produced by Sugar Pop Productions in 2018. Davian founded and leads Sensory Beyond Sight: dance workshops which invite participants to experience movement without the use of their sight. His workshops have been presented at the Alexander Technique National Conference. He currently works with Camryn Watson and Inspire Inclusion Dance as a dance teacher. Davian has been a guest artist and collaborator with ShaLeigh Dance Works since 2019 and officially joined the company in 2021.

**JAN TU (AUDIO-DESCRIPTION):** Jan is a semi-professional ballet and ballroom dancer. Her dance journey started more than 3 decades ago. Just over 2 decades ago, ballet led to theater which led to [when she learned of the lack of access for people who are blind and low vision to the arts that she loves so much] audio description. Jan has described scores of live plays, dance performances, and conventions of all sizes. She is a describer of choice for audio description training. More recently she has described artwork for local galleries, the NC Museum of Art, and has assisted in training at the Nasher Museum at Duke University. Jan strives for accuracy and evocativeness. Jan is an advocate for removing barriers to all art forms whether visual, tactile, aural, or kinetic. Jan's side hustles have included edu-tainment [factual science and history education presented with humor], leading back roads tours of China, and designing jewelry. Jan is currently 'over the moon' being a grandma.

**ARTS ACCESS (PRE-SHOW AUDIO DESCRIPTION)** is a nonprofit organization founded in 1984 to bridge the cultural arts and disabilities communities in North Carolina. Arts Access's mission is to enable children and adults with disabilities to have full access to and participate in the arts and cultural life of their community. Their vision is that arts organizations will operate with inclusion as a core value, provide programs and events that are barrier free, and provide equal access to people with disabilities.

**ELVIRA BASNIGHT (CREATIVE COLLABORATOR)** was born and raised in New York but has called Durham home for more than thirty years. She has been totally blind since her freshman year of high school. She received a Bachelor of Science in business administration from Mount Olive College. Elvira has been employed in the medical arena for almost forty years and is currently employed in the private sector at Duke University Hospital. Elvira enjoys a very active lifestyle including traveling, cross-country skiing, parasailing, jet skiing, tandem cycling, snowshoeing, yoga, pilates, ballet, conditioning, swing dancing, two stepping, line dancing, and hiking. She loves visiting new places and exploring the great outdoors. Her love for music and dance reminds her she is alive and moving. The desire to move happens as soon as she hears the music, whether real or imagined. If she is moving, she is happy with a smile on her face.

**JONH BLANCO (PERFORMER)** is a Filipinx-American undisciplined artist from Norfolk, VA. They are a 2020 Pivotal Fund awardee, a 2019 Visiting Lecturer of Art Foundations at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, and a 2016 Volunteer Arts Teacher at Reality Ministries in Durham, NC. They are recognized as an activist-gardener-student-survivor of childhood domestic and sexual violence, space artist, and a good neighbor. However defined, their creative practices are described as critically whimsical, courageous, and authentic. They received their BFA in Interdisciplinary Studies at the San Francisco Art Institute and an MFA in Studio Art at UNC-Chapel Hill. Jonh works at the Pullen Arts Center, volunteers at H.E.L.P. (Health Equipment Loan Program, Durham, NC), and is a company member of ShaLeigh Dance Works and a co-creator at BASEMENT art space.

**MAURI TERRA CONNORS (PERFORMER)** is a dance artist based in Durham, NC, originally from Rockbridge County, VA. She makes work with movement, paper, and words. She received her BA in Dance with honors from Connecticut College in 2015, where she studied with David Dorfman,

Heidi Henderson, Shani Collins-Achille, Rosemarie Roberts, Lisa Race, and Shawn Hove. She has performed with Jenny Davies/Progeny Dance. Her writing and visual work have been included in Contact Quarterly and About Place Journal. From 2018 to 2021 she was the Artistic Director of Halestone Dance Studio, a nonprofit dance education organization in Lexington, VA. She is a passionate advocate for dance education for all ages and is currently listed on the Virginia Commission for the Arts Teaching Artist Roster. She is honored to contribute to this project as a guest artist with ShaLeigh Dance Works.

**JANIE DESMOND (CREATIVE COLLABORATOR)** first began her dance training with ShaLeigh Comerford in 2005. Together they have created a movement relationship and bond that has spanned more than ten years. They have moved together through the forms of ballet, modern, creative movement, improvisation, composition, choreography, and ShaGa. In 2018, they presented their duet, J'aime ma soeur, at DPAC for Reality Ministries' annual talent show. Janie began working with ShaLeigh Dance Works as a guest in 2019 with a performance of enVISION at The Cary Theatre. Janie is a 2015 graduate of UNC Greensboro with a certificate in Integrative Community Studies. Her goal is to share her love for dance through teaching all ages with a special interest in elementary education. She is currently working as a dance instructor with Inspire Inclusion Dance.

**CHERYL EDSON (STAGE MANAGER)** is a theater maker, educator, and writer. In addition to being the resident stage manager for ShaLeigh Dance Works, she has stage managed for Bulldog Ensemble Theatre, Sweet Tea Shakespeare, and the Durham 150 closing ceremony at DPAC. Cheryl is a board member of the National Women's Theatre Festival and a teaching artist at the Durham Arts Council. She has a BA in philosophy from Wesleyan University in Connecticut.

**HILLARY HONIG ENSMINGER (CREATIVE COLLABORATOR)** "I am still dancing!" Hillary began dancing as a child in NYC despite degenerative blindness. She studied modern dance at the schools of Graham, Ailey, Interlochen, Perry-Mansfield, and Zina Romette. In 1970 she was introduced to Haitian and African dance, the perfect rhythmic platform she needed to express herself given blindness. She has studied with the greatest masters and traveled the world in pursuit of the African root of other dance forms like tango. Hillary graduated from Hamilton College with a BA in the Arts, trained as a chef at the CIA, Hyde Park, NY, and has certification in Non-Profit Management from Duke and Wake Tech. For 25 years, she owned and operated two restaurants and A Wandering Feast Catering. She is a proud mother of two plus her guide dog Nettles. Currently, Hillary has been working as a consumer advocate to eradicate stigma and promote inclusion for those with disability in the Durham community.

**LUCIA DEL VECCHIO GRAY (TEXT DESIGNER)** is a playwright, director, writer, and business owner living in Asheville, NC, with her family. She holds an MFA from the University of Texas at Austin in Theatre/Playwriting, and her plays have been produced in Asheville numerous times over the last 15 years. After directing and serving as head writer for the yearly local hit The Bernstein Family Christmas Spectacular for its last four years, Gray has transitioned to working on a long work of fiction. Gray has also served as dramaturg and general fun consultant for ShaLeigh Dance Works intermittently for the last decade.

**KATE GUPTON (PERFORMER)** is a graduate of the University Of North Carolina at Greensboro. She holds a BFA in Choreography and a K-12 public school teaching license in dance. Kate is currently the dance teacher at North Graham Elementary school, a public title 1 school in Graham, NC. Additionally, Kate is a choreographer for the Rainbow Dance Company, a multi-generational modern dance company in Raleigh, NC. Currently Kate can be seen performing in Durham with ShaLeigh Dance Works and Tony Johnson. Kate also enjoys teaching dance to all ages at private studios throughout the state. Kate has had the pleasure of training at the American Dance Festival in Durham, NC, Unitec in Auckland, New Zealand, and Arts Together in Raleigh, NC.

**KEVIN HIGGINS (AUDIENCE ACTIVATOR)** is a high school junior from Chapel Hill, NC. He started dancing at age 5, and for more than a decade, his passion for dance has been constantly growing. He studies modern, ballet, jazz, and tap at the Ballet School of Chapel Hill and has also developed a love for choreography. His choreography was selected by ADF to be featured alongside the

Nasher Museum of Art's RESIST COVID/TAKE 6! exhibit by Carrie Mae Weems, and he has also helped choreograph for dance companies that he is a part of. He has also performed in Voices: A Walking Tour, hosted by the Process Series at UNC. Last summer he performed with ShaLeigh Dance Works for The Stars Are Out at ADF, and he is excited to be performing with them again for this season!

**ERIC HIRSH (COMPOSER)** is a jazz pianist and composer living in Durham, NC, where he creates music as leader of his own jazz quartet, as co-director of Afro-Cuban ensemble Orquesta GarDel, and as a member of hip hop group The Beast. His debut album as bandleader, Distillation, was released in 2018. Hirsh is a 2012 recipient of the North Carolina Arts Council Composer Fellowship, and a four-time winner of the Herb Alpert Young Jazz Composer Award. He has been in residence at the Kennedy Center's Betty Carter Jazz Ahead, Ravinia's Steans Music Institute, and the School for Improvisational Music.

**NICHOLAS F. JACKSON (SCENIC DESIGNER & SOUND BOARD OPERATOR)** (Nic) is a designer, technical director, and occasional choreographer. Most recently Nicholas was an assistant professor and head of the MFA Technical Direction program at the University of Houston. Nicholas received his MFA from the University of Memphis and BFA from the University of Wyoming, both in theatrical design and production. Nic is returning to the Triangle area after being the technical director for ADF in 2018. Nic is very happy to be a part of this work from ShaLeigh Dance Works as an accessible performance for a traditionally underserved part of the community.

**JEREMY KUMIN (LIGHTING DESIGNER)** career in lighting spans 35+ years between entertainment and architectural projects. He has designed the lighting for plays, musicals, opera, dance, video, fashion shows, special events, gardens, commercial building exteriors, and much more. He received a BA in Drama at Duke and then an MFA from Brandeis in Lighting Design. In '87 he interned with the lighting designer at ADF. Later dance projects included two years touring the USA and Europe with the American Indian Dance Theater. He has designed for choreographers such as Carlota Santana, Laura Dean, Amanda Selwyn, and more recently Shaleigh Dance Works and OM Grown Dancers. He has guest taught at universities such as Brandeis, NYU, and SUNY Purchase and is named as a co-inventor for US Patent 8950901 (LED fixtures). From 2019 to the present he has worked with Southern Lights of Raleigh designing outdoor lighting for high-end residential and commercial properties.

**HANNAH NICOLE MARR (PERFORMER)** was born in Raleigh and currently lives in Durham, NC. She graduated in 2017 from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts. Hannah has been a company member with ShaLeigh Dance Works since 2017 and has taken on the role of rehearsal director in 2022. She is also a company member with OM Grown Dancers and is a dance teacher and choreographer to all ages for many studios and programs around the area, including TRAIN at Threehouse Studios, Stage Door Dance Productions, and Ninth Street Dance. Hannah also guest teaches and choreographs for many schools and studios both locally and out of state. Hannah has been honored to perform works by Doug Varone, Paul Taylor, Martha Graham, Wayne McGregor, Juel D. Lane, Ming-Lung Yang, Netta Yerushalmy, Kira Blazek, and many others.

**CHEMAE MEBANE (CREATIVE COLLABORATOR)** was born in Coupeville, WA, and raised in Oxford and Raleigh, NC. She attended North Carolina A&T State University and is now based in the Raleigh area. She is currently attending the Career and Training Center under the Vision Services of the Blind to return to school in the fall at Wake Tech for Human Resources Management. She performed as a part of her high school theater and served as house production manager and backstage crew. She is a member of the International Thespian Society. She loves the beach, singing, and listening to music and books. Dance is important to her and gives her a way to express herself. She loves to dance to all types of music. Her mission is to help advocate and improve equity and inclusion for the visually impaired community within business and in life.

**CHRISTINE MCINNIS (COSTUME DESIGNER)** is a costume designer, maker, and theatrical gypsy, having lived and worked professionally in New York, Chicago, Las Vegas, Washington, DC, Louisville, Cincinnati, and now the Raleigh-Durham area. She previously worked at Carolina Ballet and Nevada Ballet and has toured nationally and internationally with touring productions of Jesus Christ Superstar starring Ted Neely and Carl Anderson, West Side Story, The Sound of Music

starring Barry Williams, Swing!, and Say Goodnight Gracie starring Frank Gorshin, among others. She has also designed costumes locally for various plays at Theater in the Park in Raleigh. When not working on costumes, Christine can be found hunting for vintage sewing patterns and clothing, practicing Reiki as a Certified Reiki Master, and enjoying travel and cruises with her family.

Since making the jump to become an independent dancer, Marco has participated as a dancer in Tobacco Road Dance Productions "In Concert," Richmond Dance Festival, the American Dance Festival, and the North Carolina Dance Festival. **ALEXIS "LEXI" OVENDEN (PERFORMER)** is a multidisciplinary from Boulder, CO. She's worked with ADF as their Production Stage Manager alongside companies like Pilobolus, Paul Taylor Dance Company, Shen Wei Dance Arts, and more. She graduated in 2020 from Appalachian State University with a BA in Interdisciplinary Studies, Management for Dance, with minors in dance and somatic sustainability. Currently, she loves training in ballroom dance with partners Vadim Terentiev and Serhiy Titarenko at Fred Astaire Dance Studio, Durham. She has worked on extensive marketing campaigns with professional race car drivers, real estate brokerages, and wedding industry leaders. She is a marketing manager, choreographer, and a cake artist. Her unique outlook on marketing stems from her arts background. Deseree has danced for more than 20 years and been choreographing for 6 years. She has the ability to use her dance background to integrate marketing strategies into a piece of art.

**ALEXA VELEZ (PERFORMER)** is a photographer, video artist, and dancer based in North Carolina. As a multidisciplinary artist, her work draws attention to our disconnect from the natural world and seeks to restore a connection through imagery, movement, and sound. In 2017, she completed her undergraduate studies at the University of North Florida where she received a BFA in photography and a BA in English with a minor in film studies. In 2021, she graduated from Washington University in St. Louis with an MFA in Visual Art. As a graduate student, she was a recipient of the Chancellor's Fellowship and won best in show for her thesis work examining our relationship with the element of air. Over the last few years, her short films have screened both nationally and internationally. Most recently, she was a recipient of the Frankenthaler Climate Art Award for her video work addressing climate change.

**KRISHNA WASHBURN (CREATIVE CONSULTANT)** is the director and teacher of Dark Room Ballet, a pre-professional dance curriculum designed for the educational needs of blind and visually impaired people, the only course of its kind in the English-speaking world. Krishna holds a Master of Education from Hunter College, a BA from Barnard College, and multiple certifications from the American College of Sports Medicine with a focus in biomechanics. Dark Room Ballet has been featured in USA Today, Green Bay Gazette, North Jersey News, BLOOM Magazine, Speak Out for the Blind podcast, Eyes on Success podcast, and Bloomberg Quicktake news. Krishna Christine Washburn has performed with many leading dance companies including Jill Sigman's thinkdance, Infinity Dance Theater, Heidi Latsky Dance, Marked Dance Project, and LEIMAY.
